**2024/795 - e scooters**

Although excess cost removed the forces obligations under the Freedom of Information Act, as a gesture of goodwill, I have supplied information, relative to your request, retrieved or available before it was realised that the fees limit would be exceeded. I trust this is helpful, but it does not affect our legal right to rely on the fees regulations for the remainder of your request.

In response to your recent request for information regarding;

**How many people have been spoken to regarding the illegal use of e-scooters in public**

**Have any e-scooters been seized**

Our information is set up and searchable for our policing purposes and there is 'no seized vehicle classification' for e-scooters. To obtain the information in the format you have requested would involve manually reviewing each record on our force system to see if the involved an 'e-scooter', and that was the reason for the occurrence being recorded. The cost of providing you with the information is above the amount to which we are legally required to respond i.e. the cost of retrieving the information exceeds the 'appropriate level' as stated in the Freedom of Information (FOI) Fees and Appropriate Limit regulations 2004.

Therefore, in accordance with the FOI Act 2000 the information you have requested is exempt under Section 12 (1), and this letter acts as a Refusal Notice under section 17 (5) of the legislation.
