GoSafe apply the NPCC guidelines which outline the enforcement thresholds of not less than 10% plus 2 mph.

Following the change in the default speed limit, Chief Police Officers allowed us to increase this to 10% plus 4 mph in 20 mph limits only, meaning we start to prosecute at 26 mph in a 20 mph limit.
