2025/326 – Martins Law

In response to your recent request for information regarding;

I would like to know what action your police force has made in response to Martin's Law, if any? I have heard about drop kits and I was curious to know more about what exactly they contain, and their intended use and intended users?

In respect of the forthcoming new Terrorism (Protection of Premises) legislation North Wales Police continues, like other public authorities, to monitor its progress through parliament to ensure that we are able to best advise the public and partner agencies when the detail of the legislation is finalised and it becomes law. We receive regular updates regarding its development from the departments responsible for writing the legislation.

In terms of 'action', we are engaging regularly with our partners in other public authorities and private organisation to advise them of the legislative developments and potential requirements of the new law. We also include such updates when delivering Counter Terrorism advice to relevant organisations.

It is important to note that currently we do not advise organisations or businesses to rush to pay for training from independent providers offering to deliver training to make them compliant with the forthcoming legislation, because at this stage there remains some degree of uncertainty as to the specific requirements of the new law. In due course we will be aware of exactly what those requirements are and how and to whom they will apply. The Security Industry Authority (SIA) will be responsible for delivering direct engagement.
