In response to your recent request for information regarding;

I would be grateful if you could provide me with a copy of the latest guidance, policy and procedures that officers follow when considering dash cam footage that is submitted.

Can you please confirm if the officers who consider dash cam footage and make the decision on whether the 'evidential thresholds are met, are serving Police Officers or Civillian Staff.

We do not hold any information in relation to 'the latest guidance, policy and procedures'. Op snap policy is set by South Wales and this will need to be request from them:

Op snap is made up of Civilian staff and Police officers 3 of which are Ex/serving Roads crime officers.

Op snap offences are over seen by the Go safe Sergeant.

Could you also ask the Sergeant or Inspector who oversees and/or manages the Operation Snap team and is responsible for:

- 1. Identifying priorities**
- 2. Monitoring the decision making process**
- 3. QC i.e. ensuring consistency**

The priorities are there is either an offence or there isn't (Road traffic law is very black and white).

The decision making process is consistent with the threshold for the offence i.e Careless driving - The standard of driving falls below that of a reasonable and competent driver.
